

Domestic Abuse and Safeguarding Children



Background

The trauma that children experience when they witness domestic violence in the home plays a major role in their development and physical well-being, effects of which can last into adulthood. The [Domestic Abuse Act 2021](#) recognises children as victims of domestic abuse rather than witnesses.

Domestic abuse can also be a sign that children are suffering another type of abuse or neglect.

- Identify the impact of domestic abuse on parenting capacity.
- Link the effects of domestic abuse on a child's welfare and development.

- Understand local support and safeguarding procedures for those affected by domestic abuse and their children
