Domestic Abuse and Safeguarding Children



Background

The trauma that children experience when they witness domestic violence in the home plays a major role in their development and physical well-being, effects of which can last into adulthood. The <u>Domestic Abuse Act 2021</u> recognises children as victims of domestic abuse rather than witnesses.

Domestic abuse can also be a sign that children are suffering another type of abuse or neglect.
